The importance of well trained wool handlers

- Don't underestimate their value
- In the eyes of the processor they are the most important members of the team

Job description of a wool handler

Must be able to perform key duties as the key member in a wool harvesting team

Responsibilities	Preparation and separation of:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Teamwork - link between shearers and the woolclasser • Wool flow rates • Keeping the workplace clean and tidy • Penning up • Pressing (packing) bales • Sweeping the crutch to remove urine stain and or dags • Removal of all shanks • Picking up and throwing the fleece • Efficient skirting of the fleece • Wool rolling 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Bellies • Stains • Locks • Shanks • Crutch wool • Top Knots • Black & medulated fibres • Fly blown • Brands • Wiggs
